## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE EXPANSION BAND ELECTION FORM**

This form should be used by Public Safety licensees currently operating in the Expansion Band that wish to remain in the Expansion Band. The Expansion Band is located at 815-816 MHz/860-861 MHz (812.5-813.5 MHz/857.5-858.5 MHz in certain areas of the Southeastern U.S. (specifically, certain counties in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee), except within a 70-mile radius of Atlanta where it is located at 813-813.5 MHz/858-858.5 MHz). To facilitate frequency planning, this form should have been completed and returned to the 800 MHz Transition Administrator, LLC (“TA”) no later than September 27, 2005 for Wave 1 licensees, January 3, 2006 for Wave 2 licensees, April 3, 2006 for qualifying Wave 3 licensees, October 3, 2006 for Wave 4 licensees, and January 15, 2009 for Public Safety licensees in Canadian Border Regions 7A and 8.

The Federal Communications Commission’s (“FCC’s”) 800 MHz Report and Order envisions that Public Safety entities currently operating in the Expansion Band will be relocated unless they affirmatively elect to remain on their current frequencies. Potentially affected licensees in the Southeast U.S. should consult the FCC’s Second Erratum to the 800 MHz Report and Order, which is available at [http://hraunfoss.fcc.gov/edocs\\_public/attachmatch/DOC-252929A1.pdf](http://hraunfoss.fcc.gov/edocs_public/attachmatch/DOC-252929A1.pdf), for information about the counties in which the Expansion Band is at 812.5-813.5 MHz/857.5-858.5 MHz.

For licensees along the U.S.-Mexico border, there is no Expansion Band in the Sharing Zone (within 110 km (68.35 miles) of the border between the U.S. and Mexico) or in NPSPAC Region 5: Southern California. There is an Expansion Band at 815-816/860-861 MHz outside the Sharing Zone in NPSPAC Region 3: Arizona, Region 29: New Mexico, Region 50: Texas – El Paso, and Region 53: Texas – San Antonio. Public Safety licensees that are located on Expansion Band frequencies outside the Sharing Zone in these regions that want to remain in the Expansion Band should complete and return this form as soon as possible but no later than **November 20, 2013**. The timing of when a licensee may actually relocate, if it so chooses, to its new frequencies will be dependent on its negotiations with Sprint and whether it must move in coordination with its interoperability partners.

1. Licensee Name – Please provide the name of your organization. This should be the licensee of record with the FCC and the organization that will enter into contracts with Sprint. Please explain in the Comments field if this organization is not the licensee of the call signs included in this request or if the request involved multiple licensee entities, etc.
2. Call Signs – Please list all 800 MHz call signs to be included in the Expansion Band election.
3. Locations and Frequencies – For each call sign, please list by location numbers from your FCC license all current frequencies that are included in the Expansion Band election. If your request covers all locations and all Expansion Band frequencies, please enter “ALL.”
4. Comments – Please provide any related comments. Note that this step is optional.
5. Contact Information – Please provide complete contact information for the organization. Please ensure that this contact information matches information provided in your Point of Contact Form if you have submitted one to the TA.
