

Website/Material Use Policy

APPROVED POLICY:

Reproduction, linking, or framing of any TA materials (online or written) requires prior written approval from the TA.

The 800 MHz Transition Administrator, LLC ("TA") permits other parties to reproduce, link and frame the materials on the TA's website.

REPRODUCING

Parties cannot reproduce all or part of the materials on the TA's website (or other TA written materials) without the prior written consent of the TA. All parties interested in reproducing all or part of the materials on the TA's website (or other TA written materials) shall make a written request of the TA at least ten business days in advance of the proposed reproduction. The request should clearly identify the party, the type of use proposed and the website or publication that would include the reproduction.

LINKING AND FRAMING

Parties interested in linking or framing all or part of the materials on the TA's website should provide written notice to the TA at least five days in advance of the proposed linking or framing. The notice should clearly identify the party, the type of use proposed and the website or publication that would include the reproduction, linking or framing. The TA reserves the right, at any time, to deny permission to any party to link or frame materials on the TA's website if the TA concludes that the proposed use is inconsistent with the TA's mission.

About the 800 MHz Transition Administrator, LLC

800 MHz Transition Administrator, LLC ("TA LLC") is the Transition Administrator ("TA") for the reconfiguration of the 800 MHz band mandated by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"). TA LLC has contracted with Deloitte Consulting LLP, Squire Sanders (US) LLP, Baseline Wireless Services, LLC to perform the duties of the TA. Among its duties, the TA establishes reconfiguration guidelines, specifies replacement channels, reviews reconfiguration cost estimates, monitors payment of reconfiguration costs, manages the relocation schedule, facilitates issue resolution and administers the alternative dispute resolution process. TA LLC uses information it receives solely for the purposes of administering the 800 MHz reconfiguration process and may disclose such information to the FCC or other authorized parties pursuant to the requirements of the 800 MHz Order or other applicable laws.
